CAREER PATHS

The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) expects that overall employment of human resource managers is projected to grow five percent from 2022 to 2032, faster than the average for all occupations. About 15,500 openings for human resource managers are projected each year, on average, over the decade. Common career paths or growth opportunities in human resources include:

Human Resources Manager

As a Human resource managers maximize the value of a workforce by planning, coordinating, and directing the administrative functions of an organization. As a human resource manager, you will advise other managers on human resource issues. You will also consult with top organizational leaders regarding strategic planning and talent management.

Compensation and Benefits Manager

Compensation and benefits managers plan, develop, and oversee programs to pay employees. They may also oversee wage and nonwage programs that an organization provides to its employees and evaluate job descriptions to determine details such as classification and salary.

Labor Relations Specialists

The legal issues that can arise in a workplace will significantly damage a company if handled poorly. As a labor relations specialist, you are responsible for resolving employee-management disputes, negotiating labor contracts, and coordinating grievance procedures regarding worker complaints.

Training and Development Managers

Training and development managers plan, coordinate, and direct knowledge-enhancement programs for an organization's workforce. They are responsible for identifying employee needs and developing course content and materials for training programs that enhance employees' skills.
